When you live in NYC, you hear a symphony of sounds on every corner. This week's newsletter features music, dance, and immersive events that are sure to strike a chord with you.

Learn the Art of Dance

The Mark Morris Dance Center in Downtown Brooklyn promotes dance, music, and opera as a cultural resource to engage the community. On weekends, they host drop-in classes for adults who want to give dancing a whirl. Classes include Beginner Ballet, Beginner Contemporary, and Samba.

Go "Behind the Mask"

The Paley Center for Media, which highlights accomplishments in broadcasting, has a new exhibition featuring costumes from the televised singing competition *The Masked Singer*, along with behind-the-scenes videos and photography that reveal how the show keeps its contestants' identities a secret. The exhibition runs until May 19.

Experience Opera, Live

ARTECHOUSE (Art + Tech + House), known for their experiential art exhibitions, is now hosting ASE: AFRO FREQUENCIES, a new multimedia experience. Stunning visuals from Afro-surrealist digital artist Vince Fraser are paired with pulsating rhythmic drums and spoken word from poet and musician Ursula Rucker.

<u>Seaport Kids</u> will host a variety of free and ticketed events throughout Seaport Square and The Rooftop at Pier 17 in Lower Manhattan on March 30. Family-fun activities include dance parties, face painting, and egg races.
