After sunset, New York City lights up in a vibrant color. This week's NYC Lifestyle features colorful after-dark events that will brighten your evenings.

The Field of Light

Now open in Murray Hill along the East River, <u>Field of Light</u> features 18,000 fiber-optic sphere lights spread across six-acres of winding walkways. The experience is open Thursdays through Sundays with free admission, but tickets are required.

Blacklight Yoga

The Tribeca-based hot yoga studio YogaSpark offers blacklight-illuminated classes set to vibrant music every day of the week. Studios are heated to 95 degrees so be sure to bring a towel and plenty of water.

Treetop Climbing Adventure

Long Island's Adventure Park offers a <u>nighttime treetop climbing course</u> lit by colorful LED lights. The course features zip lines, ladders, and ropes for all ages to enjoy. Available on Saturdays in May and June, tickets start at \$61 for children and adults.

The Panorama Room

Experience breathtaking views of Manhattan, Long Island City, and Brooklyn skylines from <u>the rooftop bar</u> of the Graduate Hotel on Roosevelt Island. Panoramic windows and outdoor balcony seating are complemented by an impressive cocktail menu.

A Sunset Light Show

MoMA PS1 in Long Island City presents James Turrell's <u>Meeting</u>, a free exhibition that invites viewers to gaze up at the color of the sunset through an uncovered skylight. Its 20-minute lighting program is synchronized to end at sundown when it occurs during regular museum hours.

Stargazing on the Hudson

<u>Astronomy Night</u> at The Intrepid Museum returns on April 26. Located near Pier 86 in Hell's Kitchen, the permanently docked aircraft carrier-turned-museum will host local astronomers to help visitors navigate the night sky with high-powered telescopes. Kids can also join "build-your-own" lunar lander workshops.

Dine in the Dark

Throughout April, restaurants across Brooklyn and Manhattan will host <u>Dining In The Dark</u> events. Diners select a vegan, seafood, or meat-focused menu before tying their blindfolds and enjoying a three-course mystery meal.

Immersive Gamebox

Step into the future at <u>Immersive Gamebox</u>, a new augmented reality experience on the Lower East Side. Guests can play 3D-projected video games, massive touchscreen competitions, and curated experiences inspired by Black Mirror, Squid Game, Ghostbusters, and Paw Patrol.
