

From refreshing indoor activities to thrilling evening events, this week's NYC Lifestyle is your guide to making the most of this summer, while keeping cool.



Enjoy unlimited ice cream, a pool of sprinkles, and 14 multi-sensory installations at SoHo's <u>Museum of Ice</u> <u>Cream</u>. The family-friendly museum is open every day except Tuesday, and tickets go for \$25 on weekdays and \$33 on weekends.

The Floating Pool Lady

This floating barge on the East River holds a <u>seven-lane public infinity pool</u> and docks at the edge of Barretto Point Park in The Bronx. The pool is open daily from 11:00 a.m. – 7:00 p.m., with a break for cleaning from 3:00 p.m. – 4:00 p.m.

Indoor Waterparks

For a fun day trip, check out one of several indoor waterparks just a short drive from NYC. There's <u>Island</u> <u>Waterpark</u> in Atlantic City, <u>DreamWorks</u> <u>Water Park</u> in New Jersey's American Dream Mall, and the <u>Kartrite Resort and</u> <u>Indoor Waterpark</u> in Monticello, NY.

Meteor Shower Stargazing

In July and August, two meteor showers will be visible in the night sky above NYC. The Amateur Astronomers Association will offer a glimpse through their telescopes at <u>free stargazing</u> <u>events</u> that will take place throughout the five boroughs.

FAD Market

NYPL Cooling Centers

The Insect World

Escape the heat while enjoying the wonders of nature at <u>The Insect World</u>, a new art exhibition at the IMAGINARI gallery in Hudson Square. Larger-than-life sculptures of bees, flowers, and butterflies have taken over the 12,000-square-foot space through April 2025. Tickets are \$36 for adults and \$20 for children.
